# Pedley's Picks

Jonathan Pedley, Master of Wine and Crown Cellars' Wine Consultant, makes his personal selection from the 2023 wine range.

First things first, I want to say what an utter joy it is to be writing a new edition of Pedley's Picks. We published the previous edition in March 2020 just before the first Covid Lockdown. Since then all of us in the drinks trade and hospitality industry have had to cope with the pandemic, turmoil in our business sector and the economic uncertainties of the last three years. I don't want to tempt fate, but let's hope that in 2023 we can look forward and start to return to some degree of normality (whatever that looks like these days).

# Welcome to our annual Crown Cellars portfolio tasting for 2023

Following the creation of Carlsberg Marston's
Brewing Company in 2020, we have been able to
consolidate the original wines and spirits interests of
the parent firms into an expanded Crown Cellars.
Victoria Chapman is now well settled in as the new
wine buyer, having already done a heroic amount of
work bringing the two ranges together.

Over the last few months Victoria and I have been able to meet up and taste possible new wines both at the London Wine Fair and more recently at Marston's House in Wolverhampton. The core of this year's Pedley's Picks is made up of the wines that we selected. However, I have managed to squeeze in three existing wines to make up a "baker's dozen" of personal favourites.

The largest number of new listings this year are, perhaps surprisingly, from France. I guess it shows

that our near neighbour is continuing to produce an ever expanding array of fascinating, well made and dare one say it, sensibly priced wines. First up and definitely the quirkiest of this year's new additions is an Orange Wine from Domaine de la Baume. Now the super trendy amongst you will already be au fait with the concept of orange wine, but for those of you who don't live in Islington here is a quick tutorial. As you all know, when you make a white wine you press the white grapes, release the pale coloured juice (also called must) and ferment it. Hence there is very little contact between the grape skins and the juice. By contrast, when you make a red wine you crush the black grapes but then ferment juice, pips and skins together. During the fermentation the must extracts colour and tannin from the skins giving us the colour and tannic "chewiness" of red wine. So far, so good. However, what happens if you start with white

grapes but then ferment them like a red wine? In other words, you crush the white grapes and then ferment juice, pips and skins together. More colour is extracted from the skins than in a normal white wine, a heavier and broader fruit character develops, and you pick up a little tannic astringency. Some of the natural colour compounds extracted from the grape skins have a tendency to darken during maturation, giving you the distinct "orange" appearance. In essence then, this is how you make orange wine. I would encourage you all to try the example we have listed but be aware that orange wine is definitely something you will either love or hate (I am trying to avoid using the Marmite cliché but the flesh is weak). Although they are produced just down the road from the Vin Orange, you will be relieved to hear that the next two French white wines are perfectly conventional. The Picpoul de Pinet appellation has boomed over the last couple of decades, so much so that in some vintages it can prove difficult to get enough stock. As a result we have decided to add the delicious "Nature de Roubié" Picpoul de Pinet to sit alongside our existing "Cuvée Thétis". It is worth flagging up that the "Nature de Roubié" vineyards have been farmed organically since 1985. Nearby

are the vines that produce our new Viognier "les Gazelles". Part of being a Master of Wine is trying to be objective at all times, but I must confess to having a soft spot for the fragrant opulence of Viognier.

Despite its moderate price and humble origins in Languedoc, this example has a whiff of the Second Empire decadence that makes Viognier irresistible (you see, I am disintegrating morally).

A cold shower and a bout of self chastisement has restored some degree of order. For my fourth pick we head off north to Chablis. I am delighted to be able to welcome a new producer to our Chablis stable: Catherine Gautherin. As a child Catherine learned from her father, Raoul, how to love and nurture the Chardonnay vines in her native Chablis. Nowadays she works in partnership with Louis Poitout to make her range of wines. We are listing both her Chablis and her Petit Chablis. The key difference between the two is the soil: Chablis is grown on Kimmeridgian clay whereas Petit Chablis grows on Portlandian limestone. Chablis is meant to be a bit posher, but I really like the Petit Chablis and this is what I have chosen for Pedley's Picks.



A couple of members of the Crown Cellars Wines and Spirits team (yes you, Dougal and Jacob) have, for some while, been nagging us to look at listing another Côtes de Provence Rosé. This pair rub shoulders with the beautiful people of Maidstone and Headingley, where simply everyone has to be seen sipping a super pale rosé poured from a curvaceous Provençale bottle. Well, I reckon we have nailed it with the "Chantrose" produced by Famille Ravoire. As well as looking the part, it is a lovely wine that should satisfy the discerning palates of both Kent and Yorkshire.

The two French reds that make it into this year's Pedley's Picks both come from the western, Atlantic, side of France. Given the boom in sales of Malbec from Argentina, common sense says that we should try out a Malbec from its French homeland. We have ummed and ahed a bit but at last we reckon we have the right wine under the Clément Bosquet label. It is not as dense and inky as your average Argentinean Malbec, but it is a sensibly priced, mid bodied Vin de France glugger. By contrast, the "Pure Vallée" Pinot Noir is a more refined liquid. Many of you will know how difficult it is to get good, cheap Pinot Noir. This "Holy Grail" of grape varieties is notoriously fickle in both the vineyard and cellar. Imagine our pleasure

when our long standing Loire supplier, Famille Bougrier, offered us this little gem.

Spain has long been a fertile hunting ground for

exceptional wines to add to the Crown Cellars portfolio. Veterans of previous editions of Pedley's Picks will have experienced my enthusiastic rantings about Spain in the past. Well this year is no different. Some of our longest standing customers may recall that once upon a time we listed a wine called Marius Reserva. In its day it was at the cutting edge of the rediscovery of regional Spanish wines. It had a devoted following but for various tedious reasons it dropped out of the portfolio. Well I am delighted to report that it is back in the range for 2023. However, the wine I wish to feature in Pedley's Picks is its stablemate from Bodegas Piqueras, the Old Vine Garnacha. Good as Marius Reserva is, the Old Vine Garnacha is a monster. Those of you who like reds that you can stand a spoon in need look no further. My other Spanish pick is from our favourite Rioja producer, Bodegas Medievo. The team at Medievo craft our hugely successful Finca de Oro wines. It is a "no brainer" to add their Rioja Reserva to our range. Like the best modern Reservas in Rioja it seamlessly combines red fruit, oak and aged complexity.


A pair of contrasting Argentinean wines feature in this year's Pedley's Picks. Earlier on I was enthusing about the Viognier grape in the context of the new "Les Gazelles" wine from southern France. Well, we are adding another Viognier but this time from Mendoza. The winemaking team at Viñas de Mendoza have gone for a delicate, floral style of Viognier as opposed to the slightly richer, peachy version from France.

The painstaking process of consolidating the wine portfolios inherited from Carlsberg UK and Marston's took a long time and involved tasting a lot of wines. Having worked with Carlsberg UK since 1994 I knew that side of things well, but obviously had a lot to learn about the Marston's range. Without question, the standout producer I came across in the Marston's list was Alta Vista from Argentina. It has been great to get to know their line up of wines. However, one in particular stands out for me: "Temis" Single Vineyard Malbec 2012. It is majestic. What is more, with ten years of bottle age it is taking on the aged complexity that we rarely see in commercially available New World red wines. The production is limited so if you are interested, order a case or two while we still have stock. Trust me, you will not be disappointed.

For my final picks I am staying in the New World and going for a couple of our workhorse house wines (or whatever the PC name is for everyday pouring wines these days). The Ocarina Sauvignon Blanc entered the range in 2021 after an exhaustive tendering process to freshen up and expand our portfolio of key commercial styles (along with things like Prosecco, Pinot Grigio and Chilean Merlot). As I say in the tasting notes, it is clean, crisp and refreshing. By contrast, the Gulara Shiraz is a gutsy Aussie red that we have had in the list for a good number of years. It has decent weight on the palate and plenty of dark fruit on the nose. The Australian wine industry is going through a tough patch at the moment (not least courtesy of some terrible weather) so now is a good time to give our Antipodean mates a hand.

Just before signing off I should mention that our longstanding Ponte Prosecco Rosé is now available in single serve (20cl) as well as the regular bottle (75cl).

Right, that is me done for another year. As I said at the beginning, let's hope that in the months ahead we can get back to buying, selling and drinking wine without the sense of dread and despair that has scarred the last few years.




Let's not beat around the bush: the vineyards of France took a hammering in 2021. A succession of freezing nights in April got the growing season off to the worst of possible starts. Many of the tender shoots were killed, stunting the vine's growth and curtailing the size of the potential crop. The weather was not great for the flowering either, further reducing yields, and as if this wasn't bad enough, torrential rain in July triggered widespread outbreaks of mildew.

Eventually conditions did improve in August and September, with warm and largely dry weather helping what was left of the crop to reach an acceptable degree of ripeness. The harvest was late but drama free. The total French crop was 34.2 million hectolitres, down 27% on 2020. Burgundy was perhaps the worst affected region, with Champagne and the South West (Gascony etc.) not far behind. Supplies of white wines are particularly under pressure, and we've done a lot of work to try to secure stocks of things like Chablis.


#### Petit Chablis

A greenish tinge to the straw colour is the first hint that we are in cool climate territory. This is confirmed by the crisp, lemon and green apple nose. Our supposition is borne out by a palate that is bone dry, lightish in body and zingily acid. Just a touch of butteriness on the finish indicates that we are tasting a Chardonnay that has been through malolactic fermentation. The wines of Chablis are the quintessential food wines. I am fantasising about a sole meunière as I write this, but just about any type of fish or shellfish would be a good partner (Catherine Gautherin herself suggests a few oysters with friends). The winemaking is meticulous: careful settling of the must before fermentation in temperature controlled vats. No wood is used in the maturation in order to preserve the pure fruit aromas.

#### Catherine Gautherin et Filles

#### Chablis

A classic Chablis that is tight and linear, with just a hint of creaminess.

Mid straw appearance. The aromas are quite tight and linear: there is just a hint of creaminess. The palate is dry, with mid-high acidity, and a mid-light bodied texture.

### J. M. Aujoux

#### Viognier 'Les Gazelles' IGP

This wine is beautifully aromatic and lifted, with classic peach and apricot Viognier aromas. In the mouth it is dry but only moderately acid and mid bodied. The stone fruit flavours return on the palate. The finish is rounded and smooth. I am a huge fan of pairing Viognier wines with salmon and trout. The vineyards for this wine are located in Languedoc, overlooking the Bassin de Thau near Sète. The fruit is harvested at night to capture as much freshness as possible. A partial malolactic conversion, six months ageing on the lees and a portion of the wine seeing oak are all used to add complexity and weight.









#### Domaine de Petit Roubié

#### Picpoul de Pinet 'Nature de Roubie'

This is a delicious example of Picpoul de Pinet and was an immediate hit with the Wines and Spirits Team when they tried it for the first time. The appearance is mid straw. When you swirl the glass you are greeted by youthful, floral and fruit, aromas. The taste is dry and refreshingly acid. There is weight on the mid palate and length on the finish. You do not need me to tell you that this sort of wine is the perfect accompaniment to prawns, scallops and pretty much all types of white fish (halibut is a personal favourite). The Domaine de Petit Roubié has been a pioneer of organic farming in Languedoc, receiving its first certification back in 1985. Across the estate's 80 hectares of vineyard the aim is to encourage a resurgence of the region's natural fauna and flora. Bees, butterflies and wild flowers are allowed to flourish alongside the vines.













#### Famille Ravoire

#### Côtes de Provence Rosé 'Chantrose'

Pierre Vieillescazes, the oenologist at Ravoire, carefully selects parcels of black grapes from across the Côtes de Provence appellation to make Chantrose. In 2022 the varietal composition is 55% Grenache Noir, 35% Cinsault and 10% Syrah. Once at the winery the grapes are pressed gently, with the resulting juice being chilled down to 10°C to preserve the delicate aromatic compounds. A slow fermentation then follows. After a brief maturation during the winter the wine is bottled. Chantrose has a palish pink appearance. The nose is youthful but restrained. After a while subtle red fruit aromas come through. The palate is bone dry with vibrant acidity. Juicy fruit and some weight provide balance. Well chilled (8°C), this sort of rosé is perfect to drink on its own or as an accompaniment to grilled fish.

#### 'Capucine' Vin Orange

At Crown Cellars we have been great fans of Domaine de la Baume down in Languedoc for a couple of decades so it makes sense to start our Orange Wine adventure there. The winemaking team destem the Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc grapes and leave them to macerate in a temperature controlled vat. Once the all important extraction of colour and tannin is complete, fermentation is allowed to proceed. During maturation the use of the preservative sulphur dioxide is kept to a minimum, allowing the distinctive colour to develop through subtle oxidation. The resulting wine has a deep gold colour. On the nose it is intense and broad. The dominant aromas are of ripe fruit: honeydew melon and candied peel in particular. On the palate it is mid-full bodied and dry, with a touch of astringency underpinning everything. The finish is long. The jury is still out about the temperature to serve Orange Wine: I would suggest cool but not over chilled (12°C). It is a similar story when it comes to food pairings. La Baume suggest hard cheeses and spicy dishes: I don't see why roast pork would not work as well.

## Clement Bosquet

#### Malbec, Vin de France

Were it not for the stupendous success of Argentinean Malbec, the Cot grape variety (to use its traditional name) would be little more than a curiosity in the backwoods of south western France. The sizeable plantings in Bordeaux were devastated by a frost in 1956, leaving Cahors as the last major hold out. But that is all history: nowadays Malbec is almost as popular in many restaurants as Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz. The Clément Bosquet wine we have selected is a robust and fruity Vin de France example of Malbec. The mid ruby colour is just starting to fade to garnet. It is decently intense on the nose, showing ripe plum and damson aromas. In the mouth it is mid bodied, the fruit being set off by a touch of dry tannin. A young Malbec like this is for drinking and not philosophising: order a burger and get stuck in.











## Famille Bougrier

#### Pinot Noir "Pure Vallée" Vin de France

Admirers, or more accurately devotees (I count myself amongst them), of Pinot Noir will tell you that it is the aroma of the grape that sets the nostrils twitching and the pulse racing. Forget the colour and ignore the palate for a moment (most other black grape varieties do those things better), it is the exquisite red fruit character of Pinot Noir that gets us every time. The new "Pure Vallée" Pinot Noir is brimming with just such redcurrant and red cherry perfume. It is lightish bodied with only a touch of tannin. You could serve this a little cooler than normal for a red wine (maybe 15°C rather than 18°C). As food pairings I would suggest chicken, duck or a mushroom risotto. Kudos to Famille Bougrier at the Caves de la Tourangelle in the Loire for crafting this wine from locally grown fruit.

Despite being the largest wine-producing country in the world in 2021 (44.5 million hectolitres), the Italian crop was down 9% on 2020. Frost in the spring and drought in the summer were the main culprits. As is often the case, there were some significant regional variations. The key Veneto region (home to Prosecco and a lot of Pinot Grigio) was in line with the national numbers (down 7%). Mattia Casati from C&C (one of our major suppliers) indicates that the major challenge for his business is satisfying the ever-growing demand for Prosecco, rather than any short-term supply issues in the vineyard. Elsewhere in Italy there were contrasting fortunes: yields in Tuscany were down by a painful 25% whereas Sicily bucked the trend and clocked a 9% rise.










Most of Spain dodged the spring weather challenges that occurred over the Pyrenees: any frost losses were localised and the flowering went well. Again in contrast to France, the summer was dry with some punishing temperatures in July and August. For many growers in the north of Spain the biggest threat came just as the harvest had started during the second week in September: torrential rain fell at this critical juncture, risking dilution and disease. However, the wise heads suspended picking for a few days, allowing the moisture to evaporate and the grapes to reconcentrate. The vines responded well and it turns out that the later ripening black varieties, such as Garnacha, really benefited from this rehydration after the arid summer. Our friends at Medievo (Rioja), Alfamén (Cariñena) and As Laxas (Rías Baixas) seem happy with their wines. The total Spanish crop was 35 million hectolitres, down 14% on 2020.







#### Rioja Reserva

Medievo source the grapes for this wine from vineyard plots in the "Las Planas" at around 500 metres above sea level. It is composed of the classic Rioja varieties: Tempranillo, Garnacha, Graciano and Mazuelo. Fermentation takes place in temperature controlled stainless steel vats at 28°C. The young wine is then matured: the first two years are spent in oak barrels (70% American; 30% French) followed by a year in bottle. The result is an elegant modern take on the classic Reserva style. Mid-deep ruby-garnet in colour, there is plenty of raspberry and loganberry fruit up front, followed by hints of oak and leather. The palate is mid-full bodied with yielding but grainy tannins and a long finish. Roast lamb and roast beef, Jamón ibérico and Manchego would all be perfect partners.



#### Bodegas Piqueras

#### Old Vines Garnacha Organic 'Piqueras'

This is not a wine for the faint hearted. In appearance it is deepish garnet with a hint of brick. The bouquet is incredible: damson, oak, chocolate and liquorice are all present. It is concentrated and full bodied in the mouth with a long finish. Hearty red meat dishes are its natural partners at the dinner table. The grape variety responsible for this wine is not "normal" Garnacha (aka Grenache in France) but its offspring Garnacha Tintorera (aka Alicante Henri Bouschet in France). It was bred in the nineteenth century by the eponymous Henri Bouschet to get more colour into the thin skinned and often pale coloured Garnacha. Well, dear old Henri hit the jackpot – this version has red colour not just in the skin but in the pulp. The Garnacha Tintorera vines at Bodegas Piqueras were planted on their own roots 45-60 years ago and have been dry farmed ever since. Once fermented this bruiser is matured in American oak barrels for 6-8 months to smooth it off a bit and add some toasty vanilla notes to the nose and palate.








MARIUS

Perhaps it is not surprising, given the latitude of the vineyards, that the 2021 growing season in England paralleled that in Germany. A frigid spring delayed the bud burst but in so doing restricted frost damage to a few vineyards. The flowering was not a uniform success either, courtesy of these mediocre conditions. Like the rest of us, the grape growers kept waiting for some proper summer weather that never really came. As in France, downy mildew was a challenge in many vineyards. It was September that eventually rode to the rescue, belatedly providing the sunshine and warmth that the vines needed. The harvest was late, stretching into November in some cases. Yields were low. Stylistically the fruit was high in acidity and low in sugar – the perfect raw material for sparkling wine production. There should also be some crisp still whites and rosés.

From a quality perspective the wineries in California seem to be uniformly delighted with the 2021 harvest. It was another drought year, but this time it was by fewer wildfires and heatwaves. In fact, temperatures were on the moderate side, allowing the grapes to ripen slowly but steadily. Cabernet Sauvignon is mentioned in several reports as being exceptional in 2021 with saturated colours, concentrated aromas and ripe tannins. Results are a little more mixed when it comes to yields, depending on exactly when and where the sparse rain fell. The overall crop for the USA (California is responsible for 80%) was 24.1 million hectolitres, up 6% on 2020 but down 3% against the five-year average.


#### Chardonnay

Quite a full-bodied and rich Chardonnay that shows ripe fruit and toastiness on the nose.









The 2021/2022 growing season was characterised by drought across most of the grape growing regions of Chile. There were some frost losses but overall the spring was warmer than usual. The summer was remarkably mild, with no heatwaves to disturb the steady ripening of the grapes. It stayed on the cool side coming into the harvest period. The only drama came late on when heavy rain fell in April. In most cases, quality should be very good. The growing season in Argentina was bracketed by two frost events. On 3rd October 2021 a spring frost caught some of the precocious plots in Mendoza, limiting the potential size of the crop. Six months later, on 30th March 2022, an early autumn frost brought the picking to a rapid conclusion, again curtailing the tonnage of grapes that could be gathered. From a quality and style perspective, 2022 is a vintage typified by freshness and elegance, rather than power and richness. After a normal winter, the spring in Uruguay showed significant La Niña influence, with warmer than average temperatures and very low rainfall. The team at Finca Traversa report that the fruit was healthy and that the harvest was on time. That said, 2022 was clearly a challenging year.





#### Ocarina

#### Sauvignon Blanc

Let us not beat around the bush: this is a clean. crisp, entry point Chilean Sauvignon Blanc. Pale in colour, it is light and youthful on the nose. The varietal fruit is expressed by green vegetal notes - cucumber and green pepper. The taste is dry, light bodied and refreshing. Well chilled, this is the perfect Sauvignon Blanc to serve by the glass in a bar. If it is to be served with food, go for something light and informal: pizza, fish and chips, mac'n'cheese etc. Oh, and by the way, the design team have come up with a beautiful label.

# Vinas de Mendoza

Viognier

The high altitude vineyards of Mendoza, with their cool but dry climate, are proving an ideal location for growing Viognier grapes. The winemaking strategy is simple: to get the fruit from vineyard to bottle as quickly as possible so as to preserve the varietal aromas. The wine has a pale lime colour. It is light and delicate on the nose. There are some youthful floral notes. The palate is dry, lowish in acidity and mid bodied. The finish is gentle. Pleasant and uncomplicated sums up this wine. It is probably best enjoyed on its own, well chilled. If you want to drink it with food, go for something equally light and informal, perhaps a chicken salad.









#### Alta Vista

#### Malbec Mendoza Single Vineyard 'Temis'

The starting point for this wine is a small single vineyard site, located in the Valle de Uco at an altitude of just over a 1,000 metres. The climate in this part of the Andes is extreme, with cold nights, warm days and low rainfall. The soil is light and sandy, necessitating irrigation from streams fed by snow<mark>me</mark>lt. The vi<mark>nes</mark> are forty yea<mark>rs o</mark>ld. The grape<mark>s</mark> are hand harvested and after cold soaking undergo a traditional vinification with regular punching down. Post fermentation the skins are left to soak in the newly made wine for a further month. Maturation then takes place for a year in French oak barrels, two thirds of which are new. After this the wine is bottled. The result is magnificent. Despite being over ten years old the colour is still an opaque ruby, with just a tinge of garnet on the rim hinting at the wine's age. The dense, brooding nose displays notes of prune and fig. The palate is massively full bodied but balanced and harmonious. The finish is rich and long. A rare fillet steak would be its perfect partner.

Heavy winter and early spring rains got water into the soils and refilled the irrigation dams. This was great news, as the vines having enough moisture is half the battle in South Africa. Low temperatures pushed the bud break back by a couple of weeks. This pattern of cool conditions and a delayed vineyard calendar characterised the whole growing season. Flowering passed without incident, and in the new year the grapes slowly accumulated sugar and flavour. A downpour in early March caused some concern, but the weather soon cleared up and there were no further dramas. The harvest was late but unhurried. Yet again, it looks like a vintage that favours finesse over force. The crop of 10.6 million hectolitres was just 2% up on 2020.

Australia's growing season was dominated by the currently prevailing La Niña weather pattern. This tends to bring cooler and wetter weather, and that is exactly what happened in 2021/2022. There were some frost losses in the spring and a problematic flowering in places. The high humidity meant that many growers had to contend with outbreaks of mildew. In most parts of Australia the harvest started a little later than usual. I am going to stick my neck out and say that the coolness of the year has favoured Australia's white wines, although doubtless there will be some elegant reds as well. At 12.5 million hectolitres the production was 12% down on 2021. Shortfall wasn't the headline for New Zealand this year; I am delighted to be able to report that New Zealand had a large crop in 2022. At 532,000 tonnes the harvest was 44% up on 2021 and substantially ahead of 2020 as well. This has relieved some of the availability issues around Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc, although at the time of writing (December 2022) prices have not softened significantly. From a quality point of view the biggest challenge came at harvest time when there were some substantial downpours.








#### Shiraz

Gulara Shiraz has been a stalwart of the Crown Cellars range for a decade or more. As you would expect for an Australian Shiraz, it has a good depth of ruby colour. On the nose it is juicy and youthful, with plenty of bramble fruit and a hint of pepper. The palate is mid-full bodied: the acidity is low and the tannins are smooth and rounded. It is good to drink on its own or pair it up with a meat pie or spaghetti bolognese.

# Wine tasting guide

White and rosé wines have a scale of 1–9, with 1 being very dry through to 9, which has dessert wine level of sweetness. Examples of wines which are typically graded 1 are Sauvignon Blanc and Italian and Spanish whites; 2 and 3 tend to be softer styles such as Chardonnay and Viognier; and the sweeter wines are the blush rosés, like White Zinfandel –graded at 5 or 6.

Red wines are marked on a scale of A–E. Lighter reds, like Beaujolais, Valpolicella or Côtes du Rhône will be graded A or B, while more chunky wines like Shiraz, Bordeaux and Rioja are a D or E.
